




ANDHRA PRADESH ASSISTANT PROSECUTING OFFICER SYLLABUS

 There will be a written examination in two papers.

 3 hours duration for each paper.

 Both papers will be set in English Language only.

Paper- I- Indian constitution, the code of Criminal procedure 1973, 200 marks
And Criminal Rules of practice and circular orders, 1990,
Indian Evidence Act, 1872, Indian Penal Code, Minor Acts.

Paper- II- Indian Constitution, the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 200 marks
And Criminal Rules of Practice and circular orders, 1990;
Indian Evidence Act, 1872, The Indian Penal Code, Minor
Acts.

Note: Paper-I will be objective in nature.

Paper- II will be descriptive in nature.

Qualifying Marks: For each Paper.

- **OC's** : 40%
- **BC's** : 35%
- **SC's/ST's/ Ex-serviceman** : 30%

Note: If a Candidate fails to secure qualifying marks even in one paper, he will be disqualified.

 **Age Limit: -**

- General category: Must not have attained the age of 42 years.
- BC/ST/SC : Upper age limit is relaxed up to 5 years.
- Orthopedically Handicapped person : Upper age limit is relaxed up to 10 years.
- Length of regular service limited up to a maximum of 5 (Five) years if a candidate is an employee of A.P State Government [Employees of APSEB, APSRTC, Corporations, Municipalities, Local Bodies, etc. Are not entitled to the age relaxation.] Service certificate has to be submitted by eligible candidates claiming age relaxation.
- 3 (three) years in addition to the length of service rendered in the Army, Naval or Air Force of the Union.

Note: Persons serving in the armed forces of the union, who on retirement from service, would come under the category of Ex-servicemen, may be permitted to Apply for re-employment one year before the completion of the specified terms of Engagement and avail themselves of all concessions available to Ex-servicemen but Shall not be permitted to leave the uniform until they completed the specified term Of engagement in the armed forces of the Union.

- 3 (three) years in addition to the length of service rendered as a whole-time Cadet corps Instructor in NCC.
- Up to a maximum of 3(three) years if a candidate is a retrenched temporary employee in the State Census Department with a minimum service of 6 months during 1991.

INTERVIEW - [25marks]

 Personality Test, Academic knowledge, Communication skills etc.

Note: The candidates shall be called for interview in the ratio of 1:2 with reference to the number of vacancies based on their marks in written examination out of 400 (200 in paper I and 200 in Paper II) duly following the special representation as laid down in Rule-22 and Sub-rule 2 of Rule 22-A of Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules and as per para 4 above.

Qualification:

- The candidate must possess a bachelor's degree in any subject along with a bachelor's degree in Law awarded by any University in India, established or incorporated by or under a Central Act Provincial Act or a State Act or of any Institution recognised by the UGC or any other equivalent qualification.
- The candidates who have passed five years intermediate are also eligible.

Experience:

- The candidate must have practised as an advocate for not less than three (3) years active practise in Criminal Courts in the State.
